Orders Due Sept 8, 2020

Trees will be ready for fall planting. Seed mixes contain annuals & perennials and are best suited for spring planting. Keep seeds cool and dry. Mixes are listed with highest percentage first.

Remember to consider above and below ground and always call 811 before you dig!

<p><b>Swamp White Oak</b> <i>Quercus bicolor</i></p> <p><b>Mature Height / Spread</b> : 50-60' / 50-60'</p> <p><b>Growth Rate:</b> 2 or more ft/year</p> <p><b>Height at delivery:</b> 4-5 ft</p> <p><b>Sun/Soil:</b> Full sun, medium-wet soil</p>  <p>Notes: Oaks are the #1 species for wildlife. Swamp white oak is a striking shade tree with attractive peeling bark. Good for wet spots; tolerant of drought &amp; heat.</p>	<p><b>White Pine</b> <i>Pinus strobus</i></p> <p><b>Mature Height / Spread</b> : 50-60' / 20-40'</p> <p><b>Growth Rate:</b> 2 or more ft/year</p> <p><b>Height at delivery:</b> 2-3 feet</p> <p><b>Sun/Soil:</b> Full sun – part shade, medium soil</p>  <p>Notes: Rapid-growing and long-lived evergreen tree with fine feathery needles. Susceptible to chlorosis symptoms in high pH soils.</p>
<p><b>Allegheny Serviceberry</b> <i>Amelanchier laevis</i></p> <p><b>Mature Height / Spread</b> : 15-40' / 15-40'</p> <p><b>Growth Rate:</b> 1-2 ft/year</p> <p><b>Height at delivery:</b> 4-5 ft</p> <p><b>Sun/Soil:</b> Full sun – part shade, medium soil</p>  <p>Notes: Edible berries attract birds. Attractive understory tree with 4-season interest. Tolerant of black walnut toxicity.</p>	<p><b>Black Chokeberry</b> <i>Aronia melanocarpa</i></p> <p><b>Mature Height / Spread</b> : 3-6' / 3-6'</p> <p><b>Growth Rate:</b> 1-2 ft/year</p> <p><b>Height at delivery:</b> 2-3 ft</p> <p><b>Sun/Soil:</b> Full sun – part shade, medium soil</p>  <p>Notes: Dependable, nicely shaped shrub with pretty white flowers and glossy black fruit. Prune unwanted suckers to limit spread. Loved by birds.</p>
<p><b>Save the Monarch</b> Coverage: 1 oz / 125 sqft</p> <p><b>Description:</b> a wildflower mix for butterfly lovers that is specifically made for attracting Monarchs to the garden. This mix of annuals and perennials are what Monarchs and other butterflies prefer to visit for nectar.</p> <p><b>Components:</b> Annual Candytuft, Siberian Wallflower, Rocket Larkspur, Purple Coneflower, Indian Blanket, Zinnia 'Dahlia Flowered Mix', Gayfeather, French 'Naughty Marietta' Marigold, Cosmos 'Sensation Mix', Sulphur 'Bright Lights' Cosmos, Mexican Sunflower, Hoary Vervain, Smooth Aster, Butterfly Milkweed</p>	<p><b>Indiana Blend</b> Coverage: 1 oz / 250 sqft</p> <p><b>Description:</b> a mixture of native perennials and colorful annuals that are formulated specifically for growing well in Indiana.</p> <p><b>Components:</b> Purple Coneflower, Scarlet Flax, Annual Candytuft, Dwarf Blue Cornflower, Lance Leaved Coreopsis, Annual Baby's breath, Indian Blanket, 'Alaska' Shasta Daisy, Purple Prairie Clover, Mixed Corn Poppy, Claspig Coneflower, Black-Eyed Susan, Prairie Coneflower, Plains Coreopsis</p>
